The Spring Valley Kiwanis Club needs to fill 120 volunteer slots at the Tarantino Sausage Booth in the Hofbrauhaus Biergarten at La Mesa Oktoberfest. Parents/Adults are always welcome (and encouraged) to volunteer! High school student volunteers will receive 4 hours of community service for each 4-hour shift and 3 hours for each 3-hour shift. You will get a free bratwurst or potato pancake and side dishes during your break on your volunteer shift. You can sign up for multiple shifts, but we discourage volunteering all day because you'll be standing the entire shift and there's no air conditioning or seating. There is a small "break area" (table and chairs) in the booth when you eat your meal. **LOCATION:** Tarantino Food Booth is in the Hofbrauhaus Biergarten on Allison Avenue. **THE VOLUNTEER ENTRANCE IS LOCATED NEAR 8340 ALLISON AVENUE, LA MESA.** Put that address in your map app and it will help you find the volunteer entrance. Have your ride drop you off at Palm Ave / Allison Ave or Pine St / Allison Ave. (*See maps at <http://springvalleykiwanis.org> – click on the OKTOBERFEST TAB*). If you can't find the entrance, call the Spring Valley Kiwanis Club President Mrs. Lisa Stewart at 619/456-7450.

WHAT YOU'LL DO: You'll help prep food, serve food, move food from the warmers to the serving station, heat and salt the giant pretzels, collapse boxes, wash pans, and/or help clean and replenish the condiment station.

NOTE: The Tarantino Food Booth is located inside the Biergarten, but no beer is served or sold at Tarantinos. However, to get to the food booth, you will be walking through the Biergarten.

WHAT TO WEAR/BRING: Comfortable clothes (t-shirt with your high school name on it, if you have one). Bring an apron if you have one. Bring something to tie back your hair and/or wear a hat to shield your face from the sun. Most areas of the food booth are under a tent, but you'll want to use sunscreen. Wear COMFORTABLE shoes (no sandals or open toe shoes) as you'll be standing for the whole shift and you'll want your feet to be protected. Plan for hot temperatures. **Bring a WATER BOTTLE and the signed permission form.**
